In the Trap of Disvalue. The loss of money, love, and self-esteem as a narrative matrix

Abstract

Through Schnitzler's short stories Night Games and Fräulein Else I will address the role of loss — in gambling, affect and self-esteem — as a narrative matrix. In both stories, money can be interpreted as a symbol of unresolved psychic dynamics and the central theme appears to be the process of attributing value: to money, but also to relationships with others and even to oneself. The "loss of value" becomes ruinous and brings the main characters to suicide.
